Bridges Pregnancy Clinic and Care Center	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a faith based, life affirming and life saving non-profit which provides a comprehensive network of care. • empowers those in Sonoma County facing pregnancy decisions by providing advocacy, education and resources.
Feathervine	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • provides opportunities for mutual support of churches and to make the good news about Jesus known in word and deed. • coordinates meetings with local pastors to encourage one another and pray for their cities and governments.
Intervarsity/ Sonoma County Schools	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • establishes witnessing communities for students and faculty who follow Jesus as Savior and Lord at local colleges and university (SRJC, Sonoma State, etc.) • local group hosts bible studies for undergraduates, graduates, faculty and athletes., monthly gatherings for fun and spiritual growth, host weekend retreats throughout the year and offers mission opportunities.
Redwood Gospel Mission	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a gospel-oriented ministry, mobilizing the community to minister to the lost, the least, the lonely, and the broken with the love of Jesus Christ through various homeless services, recovery programs, vocational training, jail ministry, outreach events, and the thrift store. • Redwood Gospel Missions today is the largest privately funded homeless services provider in Northern California
Young Life	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a Christian ministry that reaches out to middle school, high school, and college students to introduce adolescents to Jesus Christ and help them grow in their faith • Hosts 7 clubs: Piner, Santa Rosa, and Rancho Cotate High Schools; Windsor and Rohnert Park Middle Schools; a Fine Arts Club introducing Jesus through the arts; and a Capernaum Club for kids with disabilities .

Youth with a Mission: Sonoma County	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • serves as a catalyst for God's work by collaborating with others — discipling and equipping young people to form a generation of believers and cultivate a vibrant, image-bearing community. • serves alongside Sonoma County communities through practical and compassionate outreach, including community service, youth mentoring, Bible training and cross-cultural engagement.

Missions of Hope International (MOHI)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • through education, holistic ministry and the power of the local church, MOHI helps to break the cycle of poverty and bring hope to those in need in Kenya and Liberia. • MOHI builds schools, plants churches and offers comprehensive solutions to tackle challenges in individual lives while pointing them toward the hope of Christ.
Mission Voz Que Clama	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the "Voice That Cries Out Mission" (VQC), based in Tuis, Costa Rica, is a Christian ministry founded to carry messages of hope and community service, focused on spiritual growth and social support. • a living community that supports the local population, including activities for children and personal development, inspired by the biblical message of preparing the way
YWAM Papua New Guinea: Aisolie and Jeana Omal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • supports the medical ship ministry delivering essential, lifesaving healthcare to remote, isolated, and underserved coastal communities in Papua New Guinea • missionaries Aisolie and Jean Omal serve onboard and at port ensuring the delivery of services like medical care, dental care, eye surgery, testing for infectious diseases (malaria, TB, leprosy), and primary care.
Zambia Safe House	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • supports the first women's shelter in Zambia, which provides shelter, education, and self-defense training. • Assist in construction and operation a safe house for women and children, fleeing domestic violence in Zambia where one in every six women are abused in their marriages.

SRRC is also active in: Annual Harvest Party, Mexico Mission Trip, Proctor Terrace School, the City Kids Festival, the RGM Nomadic Shelter, the New Life Program, the ARK Sober Living House, Covenant Christian Academy, Food Ministry, 1-minute spot on K-Faith and the RGM Chapel program.
